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

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

### FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

Phew! Now that the dust has settled from last meeting's Atlantic thrash (which is not strictly true, but at least the wheels have stopped turning even if the legal wrangles continue) we can lean back and relax in the atmosphere of a traditional "clubbie" meeting. And who better to sponsor today's club meeting than THE club itself, The Scottish Motor Racing Club Ltd., organisers of motor racing at Ingliston. While formed originally with Ingliston in mind (don't forget, however, the club's origins in the Border Motor Racing Club) now that the SMRC have consolidated their organisational abilities at Scotland's premier circuit they are not content to rest on their laurels. Members are catered for socially with, amongst others, film nights, "natter 'n' noggins", motor sporting forums (should that not be "fora"?") and the now famed Annual Dinner Dance (21st November, 1980), and each member receives monthly a copy of the club's own magazine "Wheelspin", full of home spun philosophy and other racing tit-bits from the pen of Scotland's resident motorsport encyclopaedia, Graham Gauld (which just proves that it isn't Graham who writes this rubbish in the raceday programmes!). The club naturally organises the racing at Ingliston, working in close harmony with promoters, Scotcircuits Ltd., and members again have an opportunity of acquiring discounted season tickets for the circuit. Members and quests too have right of free admission to the paddock on race days and to the Members' Pavilion (with licensed bar and dining room), while member competitors also enjoy discounts on race entry fees. And just to prove that Scottish Motor Racing is not confined to Scotland, the club are arranging to send a club team to compete in the six-hour relay race at Silverstone either in 1980 or 1981 (if arrangements can be finalised in time the team will be sent off this year, but should that prove impossible then undoubtedly a team will be going in 1981, in which case Club Members may well have an opportunity of participating in the choice of team members!) All of which must be excellent reasons for you to complete and send off the Club Membership Application Form at the end of this programme, if you are not already reckoned amongst the ranks of the SMRC.

This being the second last race meeting of the Ingliston season thoughts are, of course, turning now to the Scottish (and North British) Championships, and in many cases it is clear that the final outcome will not be known until the chequered flag drops on our 12th October race meeting. Indeed, about the only championship already sewn up is the Shell Championship for FF1600 cars in which Tom Brown (48) now has an unassailable lead, thereby proving himself the man for the job in teaching aspiring drivers how to race at his new racing drivers' school. The battle is truly joined, however, for the runner-up slot, Roy Low (69) currently on to this by a whisker from Bryan Gowans (82). Roy's overall championship chance came to grief last time out when he tangled with Keith Wickham's Van Diemen (56) (see photographs herein), which is pehaps a shame when one remembers that, in July, he shared fastest lap and a new FF1600 lap record with Tom Brown in a nailbiting Shell Championship race then. Fast improving to (3rd last time out!) is Tom Brown's protégé, Chic Stenhouse (89) who now overtakes Duncan Hall (60) for third place, a mere point ahead of Keith Wickham (56) and Vic Covey (80). If the lead of the Shell Championship is resolved, however, not so with the Laidlaw Formula Ford North British Championship where many of the Shell contenders are having their revenge on Tom Brown! With only four rounds to go (final round is at Ingliston on 12th October), Keith Wickham holds the Championship lead, pursued relentlessly by Ray Joyce (73), Bryan Gowans, Wally Warwick (58), Tom Brown, Roy Low and Duncan Hall. All a recipe

for some excellent FF1600 racing today. And don't forget that it is today's Shell Championship race | this | counts for both the Shell and Laidlaw Championships — the **Wrangler Trophy Race** is a preliminary race, the first four from which join the fastest 12 from practice in Event 5.

In all of the Scottish Championships competitors may "drop" the two worst results (or "non-results"!) from their score, so that (for example) only the best 5 out of 7 results will count in the Lothian Chemical Co. Ltd. Formula Libre Series. The two leaders, David Leslie (8) and Stu Lawson (14) each have four scoring results to date, and in each case they are all class wins! David, however, must surely be the favourite, having so dominated The Glasgow Herald Races at Ingliston this season in his immaculately prepared Ralt RT4. Not content with local honours, however, at the time of going to Press David is also poised on the verge of a major National victory in the Hitachi Atlantic Championship, one of the country's leading single seater Championships, and due credit for this fine Scottish effort must go to both David and his Edinburgh based sponsors, The Hope Scott Garage. Indeed, David's appearance here today will entirely depend upon the Hitachi results at Cadwell Park on 7th September since, if he does not tie up that series then, he will be obliged to carry the Saltire to Snetterton today instead of Ingliston, which will leave himself with everything to do on 12th October! It could thus be paradoxical that, by seeking to clinch the major U.K. Championship, David opens the door to let Stu Lawson reap the rich (and golden) rewards of the Scottish Libre series, first prize comprising a gold trophy of 4 gold sovereigns! Watch out too for the Caledon Coal Co., sponsored Ralt of David Duffield (20) whose consistency has slotted him into third place, while

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

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


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although not registered in the Championship, we can also ecpect some excellent driving from Cameron Binnie (3) in the Andy Barton Racing March. Today also being a counter in the North British Libre Challenge, don't forget that a mere 4 points cover the N.B. leaders — Tony Dean (who may just make it to Ingliston for today's race) has it by a short aerofoil from George McMillan (17), Bernie Hunter (7) and Stu Lawson!

If you're confused by the multiplicity of Championships, then you might as well forget the Clubman's cars today since no fewer than four series are involved in events 3 and 6! Clubmans cars are, in fact, the epitomy of club racing and we are thus delighted to welcome back to Ingliston the Southern Clubmans brigade for a round in the Clubmans Register Championship, joint leaders in which are Mike Dixon (1) and Jim Yardley (28) ahead of Andy Smith (24). (Both races are also rounds in the Lowland Tyres Championship and in the North British Clubmans Challenge), With Chris Hart, Richard Mallock, Chris Greville-Smith and a host of old (and new) Clubmans friends we are also pleased to renew acquaintanceship with some of our sponsors. Calor Transport, for example, return with the Clubmans 'B' brigade, while for the 'A' Class race an amalgam of current and former racers combine to fund the richest ever Clubmans race in Scotland Burntisland's Sandy Watson, of Watson Motor Spares and Auto Salvage is one, while mine host at The Old Chain Pier, Granton, is none other than the infamous Mike Shakespeare (Him of production and special saloon "fame")! And pitching in with substantially discounted accommodation at The Royal Circus Hotel is erstwhile Scottish Clubmans Secretary, Alistair Mackintosh. It's really great to see so many people (and sponsors) all pulling together to make possible what should be two of the most memorable Clubmans races yet seen at Ingliston. And as a bonus (to lighten the atmosphere), news too of a "reprieve" for Clubmans cars in Scotland next year. The ingliston Joint Race Committee have now decided that, due to an expected lack of availability of Sports 2000 cars, the sports car championship in Scotland for 1981 will be open to A and B Class Clubmans as well as Sports 2000 cars (and while on the subject of Formula 2000 cars, todays round of the Harrison Bros.

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N.B. FF2000 Championship is being run along with the **Calor Transport** race). Continuing the 1981 theme, news too that next year's Clubmans Register Championship will be sponsored by BARC, which must be good news for Ingliston in our North British Series tie-up with BARC's Northern Centre. With all that good news going for them, and record prize funds, the Clubmans boys just have to be loaded for bear today!

Premier Championship of the year is of course the McLaren of Broxburn BL Cars Championship for GT Cars, and nowhere is the position so close as in this series. By the time the cars take to the grid for this afternoon's Caledon Coal Company Trophy Race and Laidlaw Trophy Race (both heats of the Scottish Motor Racing Club GT Final) we will have the results of last Sunday's "English" round at Croft, and much will depend on the scores obtained there. (The updated Championship Table will be broadcast today.) What is clear is that, for the first time in many years, no single class in the Championship is having things easy, and each class leader has had to pull everything out to claw his way to the top. For Doug Niven (101) the thorm in his flesh has been Laurence Jacobsen's remarkable 2-litre Imp (104), while all along keeping a weather eye peeled for Walter Robertson's DFVW (105). In the 1500 c.c. class Eric Paterson's Imp (126) at long last got itself together and took up where Jimmy Robertson's Skoda left off, his principal opposition coming from Jimmy Pinkerton's Maguire Mini (128) and Gus Young's Davrian (145). Both Doug Niven and Eric Paterson were on equal points prior to last Sunday's Croft outing, and both are effectively basing their Championship challenges on three class wins, so that there is really nothing to choose between them. Of special note, however, is the third placed man, Jim McGaughay (154), leading the 1-litre challenge, who fought off the threat from the Davrians of George Coghill (174) and Kenny Coleman (172) early in the season to prove (and you don't prove it any better than with a class lap record) that the Imps do have the legs of the Davrians! While one would expect the new GT Champion to come from the three current class leaders, such is the state of play that you can't rule out a last minute spurt by anyone of half a dozen drivers — Walter Robertson (105), Murray Burgess (107), Gus Young (145), Jim Pinkerton (128), Alan Ritchie (148), George Coghill (174) and Kenny Coleman (172) for example. After all, the final three rounds can be worth a total of 24 points in the right circumstances! So, whatever happens today, it looks as if our last race meeting at Ingliston on 12 October is going to be a humdinger. Don't forget also that we indulge in our annual nostalgic trip into the past in October, with the traditional historic racing car race, recapturing for a brief (and competitive) moment the sights, sounds (and smells) of a bygone era in the sport. So look forward to the past and see the season out in style at

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
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
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
