





FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT

Welcome back, then, to the first Ingliston Motor Race Meeting following the annual June lay-off for the Agricultural Show (once again a highly successful and enjoyable event and for which our Landowners, the RHAS, are to be congratulated). With Clubmans Sports cars hogging the limelight today, and Calor sponsoring Charles Tippet with his Gryphon C4A, it is not surprising that Calor Transport are the sponsors of today's Race Meeting and we welcome their return to Ingliston. Today sees perhaps the best motor racing value for money to be found anywhere in Britain, with a full ten race programme (including two National Championship rounds) all at an entrance price of a mere 60p (reductions for children). Where else, we ask, could you go motor racing at 6p per race! (Certainly not in a racing car-competitors take note!)

Having beaten the drum somewhat let's now get down to seeing what we have on the cards for today's race meeting. The first event of the day, for Special Saloon cars up to 1000 ccs, is almost certain to see a resumption of the season long duel between Dundee's John Fyda (143) in the beautifully prepared Agra Imp and Ian Forrest (129) in his Kirkliston based Forrest Imp. While John Fyda took the honours in April, in May he was forced to retire on the 5th lap while leading, leaving it to Forrest to sweep home ahead of Peter Pitman (134). Indeed, now that Sedric Bell has vanished from the scene, it is amazing how the Imps have taken over from the Minis in the small saloon class and today should see no exception. Following the small saloons is the Industrial Distributions Formula Ford Race in which the MacDonald Shand Ecurie Ecosse entered Hawke DL12 of Stu Lawson will be endeavouring to increase its already substantial lead in the Bernard Hunter Crane Hire FF Championship. Out to make it a one-two for Ecure Ecosse, MacDonald Shand have also entered their "No. 1" (can you call him that?) driver Grahaeme Hamilton in the second FF car run by them, a Van Diemen RF75 (although don't be surprised if you find Dave Steedman at the wheel of this one!). One driver to emerge from the ruck this year, and who is now challenging in second position in the Scottish FF Championship, is George Franchitti (28) in his Hawke DL12 while, again showing greatly improved performance this year is

Colin MacLean (32) with his updated MRE. Unfortunately, however, one of the major problems facing Formula Ford competitors at Ingliston this year is that Stu Lawson appears to be so good that there is very little that anyone seems to be able to do about it although, with the possibility of mechanical failure always present, the Hawkes will be ready to pounce (excuse the pun).

Then its on to the first of the two rounds of the National LEC Refrigeration Championship for Clubmans Sports cars. The first race is for class B Clubmans cars, these being sports cars powered by the 1600cc Formula Ford engine. While the editor has little knowledge of the Clubmans sphere, we can do little better than to suggest that you keep an eye open for Chris Greville-Smith (Phantom), Nick Adams in his Mallock U2 Mk 14 and local class B Clubmans' ace, Alastair Mackintosh in his Mallock U2. While Alastair knows his way around Ingliston blindfold, so too may Dick Mallock who was second to Neil Ginn in the Formula Ford Championship in 1971 and has appeared at Ingliston on about ten occasions (his last race here being in 1974 when he was unfortunate enough to do-in his collar bone at the Esses). Dick is driving the works-development Mallock U2 Mk 16E powered with a Holbay FF engine and it will be interesting to see how he fares.

In Modified Sports cars this year we have seen a sudden upsurge in smaller capacity cars handing out a fair leathering to the larger cars, not the least of the giant killers being Ken Allen in his ASM Clan Crusader (85) and John Kirk with the Davrian (90). There are also Davrians from Ken Coleman (83) and Ian Gardner (92) while, in the over 1300 class, Eric Liddell (65) will be seeking to consolidate his joint British Caledonian Championship lead with the Jensen Healey. Homologated as a Modsports at last, N Mulloy fields the Lotus-type 47 Europa against the usual host of Triumph GT6s and Lotus Elans. Event 5, for Special Saloon cars over 1000ccs (both this and event 1 counting for the Lombard North Central Scottish Saloon car



Championship) sees perhaps the most interesting Special Saloon car battle at Ingliston since the Super Saloons were here in April. SMT now have their hands temporarily on the ex-Gerry Marshall/DTV/Castrol 2.5 litre Vauxhall Firenza (100) which makes its first debut in the hands of Bill Dryden this afternoon. On the other hand, the Border Reivers' Ford Boss Capri has at long last been launched on the track and, although this suffered an engine blow-up at Silverstone some 3 weeks ago, it is hoped to have a new 5.7 litre engine installed for today to give it its Ingliston christening. Notwithstanding the resumption of the traditional Niven v Dryden battle. Hugh Chalmers has also sorted out his 2.3 litre Hillman Avenger (112) powered by a Lotus/Norvic engine while Walter Robertson (110) has forsworn his super-charged Capri in favour of Cosworth-powered Ford Escort FVD and these two drivers will be anxious to establish themselves as front runners in the hairy saloon stakes. The well-deserved winner of the saloon car events in May, Eric Smith, returns with his incredible Mini 1275 GT (113), battling for domination in the 1001–1300cc class against Ireland's Jim McClements (118), Dundee's Jim Dryden (114) and Bob Snelson's Fiat 128 (117), the ex-Fillipinetti Group 2 car. All in all, all the makings of a first class Special Saloon car race to be followed by what promises to be one of the finest Clubmans races yet to be seen at Ingliston, the second round of the LEC Refrigeration Championship for Class A Clubmans Sports cars. The Class A cars are by far the fastest Clubmans cars about, being powered by unrestricted 1600cc engines and the undoubted favourite will be Coventry based Geoff Friswell with his Mallock-Hart Mk 16. The 1972 Clubmans Champion and 1974 Grovewood Award winner, Geoff was last at Ingliston in 1970 piloting a Formula Libre Brabham Twin Cam, an incident which he prefers to forget, having written the car off half way through that race! Without doubt, however, Geoff is presently the fastest Clubmans driver in Britain and at long last we will have a chance of seeing just what these cars are capable of on the Ingliston circuit, a track which many believe could be ideally suited to this margue of car. Certainly, lap times of around 48 secs (or even less) are anticipated from Geoff Friswell in the dry and, at that sort of speed, this type of car could be highly competitive in both Sports Car and Libre races at the circuit. Once again the editor has little idea of the merit (or otherwise!) of the many drivers competing in this event and can do no better than to give the current LEC Championship placings which should afford spectators some indication of which cars to watch for!

Event 7 is the Radio Forth race for Production Saloon cars. This class of car has undoubtedly established itself as one of the most popular with spectators and the Production Saloon car race in May saw no exception, being dubbed by all as "the race of the day". The prime movers in that event were Andrew Cowan in the "Chunky Chicks" Vauxhall Magnum and Ed Labinioh with the Radio Forth Alfa Romeo (81). While Andrew clocked up the fastest practice time, assuring himself of pole position on the grid, Ed Labinjoh, last year's joint Production Saloon Car Champion, made certain of being there alongside him as the flag fell. With the drop of the Saltire both Cowan and Labinioh surged forward side by side, the Border Rally driver's Magnum having the edge as he swept into the Esses. Andrew Cowan maintained that lead for the first lap, sweeping sideways into the Arena with full opposite lock. Labinioh's Alfa Romeo darting inside to try to take the lead at the end of lap one. The Magnum it was, however, which kept its nose in front as they crossed the line and, once again, the two cars circulated nose to tail. Entering the Arena on lap 2 Cowan again threw the Vauxhall into a controlled (at least, that's what he called it) drift and, for the second time, the tidier racing style of Ed Labinioh almost told, his Alfa Romeo repeating the inside dart to put him alongside Cowan as they crossed the line. Yet again, Cowan it was who reached the Esses first but, on lap 3, racing experience won through and, as Andrew slid wildly across the track at Arena-In, Labinjoh sneaked through on the inside and this time it was Labinjoh who took the lead sweeping through the Esses and round Caravan onto the back straight. With the crowd in the Grandstand on its feet, the two cars swept past Race Control and back into the Arena, again nose to tail. This time it was Cowan who tried to sneak through on the inside, forgetting that Ed Labinjoh is not a rally driver and is not inclined to drifting across the whole width of the track! The resulting spin put Ed Labinjoh onto the outside of the track and Cowan to the inner grass verge, stopping inches short of the protective barrier. By the time the rest of the field had thundered up behind, neither car was able to restart immediately although Andrew Cowan did seem determined to reverse the SMT Magnum out to rejoin the hunt. It was Labinjoh, however,



who was able to put his car back onto the circuit first, Cowan only managing to rejoin the race after all the other competitors had passed. For the remaining 8 laps, spectators were treated to displays of brilliant driving by both drivers, Labinjoh setting out to pull back the six places which he had lost and a deficit of some 15 secs. By lap 9 Labinjoh had picked off 5 of the cars in front of him and reduced that deficit to about 2 secs. and, on lap 10, sweeping into the Arena he pushed the Alfa past the then leading Mazda of Ian Smith (joint Production Saloon car Champion with Ed in 1974) to cross the line in the lead to the delight of a wildly jubilent crowd. Fastest lap, however, and a new class lap record, went to Andrew Cowan who had also pulled himself back up from the tail end of the field to 6th place with some masterful driving.

Regrettably, Andrew is not entered for today's race, his place in the SMT Magnum being taken by the Edinburgh concern's number one Production Saloon car driver, Mrs Jenny Birrell (180). Out in force, however, are the Mazdas for not only Ian Smith (164) and Chris Jones (165) but also of newcomer Vic Covey (169) while the new "up to £1699" class lap record holder, Ian Stirling, fields his Hillman Avenger GT. Norman Dickson from Perth makes his first Production Saloon car appearance at the hands of a Datsun 160J (168) while a small invasion from Ireland prepares for the Irish/Scottish Production Saloon car challenge race scheduled for our August Race Meeting.

Event 8 on the tightly-packed card is for Libre cars and the favourite must again be Andy Barton who, with his March 73/74B, outgunned all the more modern machinery in May to score his second Libre victory at Ingliston this year. Andy (4) is fast making himself the 1975 maestro at Ingliston although the writing was put firmly on the wall in May by Andrew leffrey (16) with his Chevron B25 Atlantic. Starting from the back of the grid. Andrew drove superbly, quietly carving his way through the field to second place, hauling in in the process an enormous time deficit and setting up the fastest lap of the day at the same time. Unlucky not to be able to come to grips with Barton in May was Iain McLaren with the immaculate Chevron B26/31 2-litre sports car driven by him this year, that having expired with clutch failure early in the race. Also out to assert himself at Ingliston in a single seater will be Perth's Norman Dickson (7) with his March 74B Atlantic while a possible starter in the 2-litre sports car class may be Peter Smith (21) with a Chevron-Ford B23. As we say, so far Andy Barton has had it all his own way at Ingliston this year but, with so many competitive cars based in or around Scotland, that situation cannot last for ever and today may be the occasion for Andy to find himself hard pressed at the front end of the field.

Then it's on to the title race of the day, The Calor Transport Trophy Inter-Nation Team Challenge Race for Clubmans cars. Although a fair old mouthful of a title, the idea is fairly simple, this being an invitation event between 4 teams of 4 cars in each team representing, respectively, Scotland, England, Ireland and Wales. The teams will be decided during the course of the racing today and will be notified by the announcer. While an overall individual prize fund is being offered, basically the race is a team affair, points being awarded according to placing and the team with the highest pointage winning the event. The first time this race was run England came out a clear winner but, with a much stronger Clubmans contingent in Scotland this year, there could be some hope for the local participants in 1975 and as much vocal help as you can give would be greatly appreciated by the drivers.


The final race of the day is for Sports and Special GT cars and this must see the favourite being lain McLaren (2) with his 2-litre Chevron B26/31. If to hand, Pete Smith (21) could give him a run for his money in the Chevron Ford B23 while Peter MacNaughtan's Chevron B23 FVC will also be moving up the field. A gaggle of Clubmans are naturally taking part as is the new 2-litre Martin BM10 of a 1974 regular at Ingliston John Corfield (63). Another 1974 regular, Les Aylott fields his

1600cc Ardua Mk 4 (88) while the diminutive Davrians and Clan Crusader (85) endeavour to show the GTs that modified sports cars can go just as quick as they can! Not to be forgotten, too, is Ed Labinjoh's class record breaking run in May with the 1100cc Fisher Spyder (74).

As the dust settles, the John Nicholson Trophy will be presented to the man who is, in the opinion of the judges, reckoned to have been the "Man of the Meeting". This does not necessarily mean that he has won a race (or even more than one race) or has even distinguished himself outstandingly by driving through the mid-field (although it is often presented to such a driver). The last time it was presented, in October of last year, for example, it went to Keith Schellenberg for his outstandingly entertaining drive in the 8-litre Barnato Hassan Special and the Award is really open to anyone who qualifies, in the spirit of the regs as having been the Man of the Meeting. It is appropriate that this type of award should be in memory of the late John Nicholson, a staunch supporter of Ingliston and, with his brilliant competitive and sporting verve, very often the undoubted "Man of the Meeting" himself at a time when such awards were unknown.

To digress, we wonder how many of you spotted the deliberate mistake (or, rather, mistakes—some of which were not so deliberate) in the May Race Programme. Yes, indeed, the car being overtaken in the photograph on page 13 of that Programme was not Jim Evans' turbo-charged RS2000 but was, rather, Strawberry Strawson's Boss Capri! All you needed to do was to turn to page 21 for confirmation! Nor was Ken Fildes driving Patsy McGarretty's Chevron on page 15! All of which just goes to show that you can't believe everything we say. You can believe, however, that the next two Race Meetings at Ingliston will be extremely special indeed, the August Meeting hosting a round of the Southern Organs Touring Car Championship of Britain, and also hosting one of the two Scottish rounds (the second Scottish round will be at Ingliston later this year) of the Irish v Scottish Production Saloon Challenge series, while, for September, we are definitely "ON" for a monumental 2-litre Sports car thrash (if only to give our local 2-litre drivers something to do for a change) with the possibility of the biggest ever pot to be offered in Scotland at around £3,000!

All splendid reasons why you should make a note of 17th August and 14th September in your diaries! Hoping to see you then.....




NATIONAL TOURING CARS and (INTER)NATIONAL 2-LITRE SPORTS CARS
