



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
FOR YOUR DAY'S ENJOYMENT


Welcome back to Ingliston after our traditional summer break (to allow our friends at the RHAS to organise, as they do so well, the Royal Highland Show). As always, the activity at Ingliston has been intense to get ready for today (for example, the barrier around the circuit is removed before the Highland Show, and replaced afterwards—a mammoth task) but, hopefully, once again we have managed to replace all the right bits in all the right places to ensure that everything goes smoothly! First race of the day, today, is for the modsports, and once again we would reckon that John Fyda (173) must be the favourite to take the chequered flag. In May, his Elan had a clear 20 second lead by the end, although, in the smaller capacity class, Brian Stevenson's Davrian (181) looked to be the only car that could possibly have done anything about it.

Real excitement, however, for the first of the saloon car heats, where Doug Niven (101), Bill Dryden (100) and Walter Robertson (105) renew their season long confrontation. In May, it looked as if Doug's 6 litre Chevvy Beetle had the measure of the others, but Bill Dryden's new turbocharger was operating remarkably well for its tender years, whilst Walter Robertson's RS 2000 was always there or thereabouts, hanging on Doug's bootlid, waiting for the right opportunity. There really is so little between these 3 cars nowadays that, so frequently, much depends on which car has the mechanical 'edge' on the day. The day to look forward to, therefore, is the day when all 3 cars (and drivers!) are on peak form, and perhaps today's the day for that. Whatever may be the case, this afternoon's saloon car racing will certainly be enlivened by the appearance of Jimmy the Pink in a mid-engined supercharged Volvo (104). This entry arrived 'out of the blue' (congratulations to Jim for the best kept secret of the year), and no one seems to know just what to expect. Knowing Jim's occupation (long distance lorry driver), it has been unkindly suggested that we can expect a "blown" Volvo Tractor Unit, but maybe that's not so far fetched after all! With Jim Pinkerton now joining the heavy brigade, and Dave Farrer begging an engine, on paper the 1300 cc class looks like being a Jim Dryden benefit (107), but Jim of course has not had the most encouraging of seasons so far, and it is perhaps pertinent to note that the most successful 1300 cc car in the Lombard Scottish Saloon Championship at this point in time is Norman Whitmey's Cooper 'S' (112). Norman has 2 second placings behind him, and it is consistency like that which wins Championships.

The F2000/Sports car race in May saw several eyebrows shooting skywards, as Kenny Allen (43) rocketed ahead of Iain McLaren's immaculate Chevron B36 (21). For several laps Kenny's Mallock kept the larger car at bay, and Iain has admitted that he had considerable difficulty in squirting his Chevron into the lead. In the process, both Kenny and Jim Stevenson (39) devastated the existing Clubmans class lap record, reducing this to 48.2 secs, and Kenny in fact went on to turn in a searing 47.8 second lap in an incredible libre performance later in the afternoon (which, not having been a Clubman's Class race, does not qualify for an official lap record). Which just goes to prove what we've been saying for the past 18 months—a really good Clubmans car at Ingliston is not to be trifled with!

The special saloon car racing in May was marred by yellow flag incidents, which caused several disqualifications. Just to set the record straight, the RAC's "Blue Book" (the "bible" of racing regulations) gives this meaning to a stationary yellow flag— "Danger, no overtaking and slow down". Where the yellow flag is waved, the message is "Great danger, be prepared to stop". The need for these signals is obvious, where an on-track incident (often out of sight of competitors until the last moment) could result in marshals

being required to operate on the track amongst competing cars. In such circumstances, it is only common sense to suggest that any car overtaking under a yellow (and, remember, the car he is overtaking will be slowing down in terms of the signal) is being reckless, and the RAC in fact specify the act of overtaking under the yellow as being an offence of reckless driving. The regulation is made for obvious safety considerations (both for competitor AND marshal) and is not one to be disregarded. While there are naturally "grey areas" (i.e., it is very hard not to break the ruling when panelling up on a slow back marker), where the infringement is clear cut, there can only be one result—exclusion.

But enough of the heavy hand! For small saloons today (where we have seen immensely exciting racing recently), we can only suggest that any one of Ricky Gauld (132), Bill Thompson (121), Roy Knowles (122), Ian Forrest (129), John Kirk (137) or Jim McGaughay (126) could come out on top today. Don't forget, however, that it is not this race, but rather the saloon car final which counts for the Scottish Championship, and so the endurance of each car is another consideration to bear in mind. There is no point thrashing the car to pieces just to win the heat, only to fall to bits in the final, and many a canny driver has kept a light touch on the throttle in this race, to devastating effect later in the afternoon. Following the small saloons, the Crawfords Catering FF race should see a cracking race between current Champion Stu Lawson (74) and the current Championship leader, Andrew Jeffrey (53), while David Duffield (60), Robin Simpson (61), Keith Lawrence (75), George Franchitti (71) and Roy Low (69) are not to be discounted out of hand.

Talking of cracking races, this afternoon's SMRC Race for Libre Cars should prove to be the proverbial "blinder". While Andy Barton is lounging in parts foreign (on his hols),

his regular contentious slot is ably filled by the return of Norman Dickson (10) resplendent in a Hart 420R powered March 772P. With Hart engines dominating European F2 racing, you can't beat 'em unless you join 'em, which is what reigning Libre Champion Iain McLaren (1) has felt obliged to do, selling his former Chevron to Bernie Hunter, and acquiring an unraced B40, again powered by a split new Hart 420R. And with Iain bettering Norman Dickson's outright Iap record in practice in May with his old car, what he'll do with the new car rather puts the wind up Midlothian Insurance Brokers! A full supporting cast (with cars of such calibre, how can you put it differently) of libre cars is headed by Bryce Wilson's Chevron (2), Bob Rollo's March (5) and, dare we say it, Kenny Allen's incredible Mallock (43)!

After the Lombard Special Saloon Final, the closing race of the day is for a poorly supported Production Saloon Car field. To improve the grid, those special saloons failing to qualify for the Lombard Final have been invited to compete in this event and any special saloon so taking part will be started 30 seconds behind the Prod Saloons. While the reason for the staggered start is obvious on safety grounds, it could prove to make the race even more interesting! Interesting, too, is the format for August 20th at Ingliston when sponsors BP combine all the fun of the fair (with balloon racing and a possible novelty motoring event for vintage cars) with the dignity and charm of an old-world motoring atmosphere as the RSAC Veteran and Vintage Car Run comes to Ingliston for a repeat of last year's extremely successful Concours d'Elegance.
