

AUSTIN ROVER

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TODAY'S MEETING

Welcome to the first meeting of the twenty-first season of motor racing here at Ingliston. It is interesting, therefore, that today's Austin Rover Challenge Meeting sees the biggest ever entry for a motor race meeting at Ingliston with over 140 cars.

We are particularly pleased that this should happen at the first meeting to be sponsored by Austin Rover who have laid on a tremendous programme for us today. As these words are written we can only hope that the weather is kind because we are in for some good racing.

As an experiment this season a Closed meeting was held in March and despite wet conditions we had over 100 competitors and the racing was electric.

Today, however, the spotlight will be on our feature race which is the first ever Scottish counter in the British Car Auctions MG Metro Challenge. This has come about as the result of some lobbying by our own Vic Covey, Ingliston's advertising man and sometime racing driver (sic.). By trying to have a round here Vic felt that he could turn the tables on his Metro colleagues but he didn't bargain for David Leslie who was signed up by Campbell McLaren to drive the Ecurie Ecosse/McLaren Building Services MG Metro. So the two Scots should have a fair chance. Expect a lot of excitement in this race, however, as the Metro drivers can get quite enthusiastic at times. I'm told that Peter Baldwin and Malcolm

Harrison have been watching the American Football on Channel 4 to get some tips for today's race but current Championship leader Roger Jones — who drives in the ultra professional OBM sponsored team with Vic Covey — is out to see that he and Vic maintain their position in first and second places in the Championship. Chris Lewis and Dave Louden who are in the next two places are not too worried for apart from Vic and David Leslie only a couple of the drivers have ever seen Ingliston before. At the last round on Easter Monday most of the drivers claimed to be looking forward to the challenge of Ingliston so give them a big hand today as we are sure they will make it a great race.

There are two Metro races, the first one the Appleyard Challenge which will

be a build-up to the main race.

Six months ago you could be forgiven for thinking that Formula Ford was feeling the chill breeze of the economic situation and there were thoughts of reducing the races to only one but the winter has seen a transformation and the best thing about it is that there are a host of Formula Ford novices coming into the class whilst at the other end Champion Tom Brown looks increasingly likely to be heavily challenged this year. Though entered this meeting in a Crossle 55 the Irish spies say that he will have a brand new Crossle 60 for the May meeting. So who are his challengers: well Cameron Binnie who used to star in Formula Ford at Ingliston has decided to make a comeback and won the race at the March meeting. Also in form are Harvey Gillanders who came to the fore at the end of last



season with his Cameron Industrial Services Van Diemen. This year he runs the latest Van Diemen RF 85. Look out too for Neil Cochrane with his Toshiba sponsored Lola, Colin Harper in the Van Diemen RF 78, Colin Birbeck in the Van Diemen RF 84, and Stewart Roden who is alleged to be driving the Scottish built Rotor Formula Ford which has some interesting design ideas.

The Taggarts Trophy Race for Road Sports Cars has brought out a heavy entry including three MG Bs which is good at this Austin Rover meeting. The men to watch, however, are expatriate Scot Robin Gray who has changed his Elan for a Caterham 7 and Maidenhead's Roger Ealand with his Marcos GT. Regulars will remember Roger's visit last year when he had everyone standing on their seats with the Rolatruc car. When you add John Mackie with his Elan and lain Gardner with another Caterham 7, you have a race up front. Raymond Stewart is also back with the lain Graham Clan.

The Clubmans/Sports Car Race will be another Clubmans car battle between John Fyda with his Mallock and Kenny Allan with his Vision with Leslie Duncan in another Vision seeking a little more luck. Sports 2000s are thin on the ground this year so that Nick Bridge should not only walk away with that group in his Shrike but should be up amongst the faster cars. Laurence Jacobsen is leaving his BDG engined Chevron at home and doing the gentleman driver bit today with his immaculate Chevron B16, surely one of the most beautiful racing cars ever built.

The Dutton Forshaw Challenge Race for up to 1600 c.c. Road Cars underlines the huge increase in support for Road Saloons which has allowed us to run two races. Both have great interest and in this one there is likely to be a renewed battle between Andrew Jeffrey's Vauxhall Nova which won in March, lain Gardner's Peugeot 205 GTi and Olly Ross's Ford Fiesta. This group should bring plenty of thrills.

The Libre Race is slightly pallid without the racing Ralts but George Coghill, the former GT competitor, now has an interesting car, the Norfrost Chevron B40 fitted with a Ford V6 engine. Derry Houston's B34 Chevron is slightly older but Houston is a promising looking driver while one of the best looking cars in the race is Gus young's Tiga which runs in Thundersports racing.

The new Single Seater class is for Ford 2000s and in this is last year's champion Stephen Robertson, son of Ingliston director and long-time super saloon driver Walter Robertson. He will not have it so easy this year as he has former Formula Libre Champion David Duffield in the Ecurie Ecosse Mondiale against him. The Mondiale is a new racing car built in Ireland; it ran well in March despite being straight out of the box so Duffield should be well up there today. Chic Stenhouse, who was a winner last year, is the main threat.

The GT Race is likely to be another thriller with the likes of Ian Forrest in the Drambuie Imp, Eric Munnoch in the black Davrian and Harry Simpson in the

Tel: 031-229 6332 Camargue Imp, but the real battle will be between Ron Cumming's Claymore Shellfish Lotus Esprit with its Ford GA engine and Kenny Coleman with the R. J. Cross Esprit Cosworth. This is Kenny's first outing with the car and the fact that

he only has a 1500 Cosworth should not hold him back.

Finally there is the Luckpenny Restaurant Road Saloon Race over 1600. In this one last year's superstar Hugh Chalmers is a non-starter as his Talbot Lotus is not ready and at the time of writing Jimmy McRae is due to drive the Ecurie Ecosse Chevette so that Jimmy is in with a real chance. The man we have to watch, however, is lan Bruce with the lan Bruce Insurance/Beacon Waste Disposal Sunbeam Lotus. Bruce, an ex-stock car driver, was brilliant in the wet in March and pushed Hugh Chalmers hard. A newcomer to watch, however, is another Scottish Rallying star, Andrew Wood who now drives the GM Dealersport Group A Vauxhall in the British Championship. On this occasion he is driving the Opel Kadett which Graham Birrell once raced at Ingliston; it should know its way round the circuit.

Have fun at this Austin Rover Challenge meeting at Ingliston and watch out for the demonstration drive by Steve Soper, one of Austin Rover's leading drivers. 

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
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
